This past summer, I went to "Batey Libertad" in the Dominican Republic. I spent 3 1/2 weeks living there, doing service work for a non-profit called Yspaniola (http:// yspaniola.org) and assisting a Peace Corps



Volunteer teach health and wellness to children ages 5-14. "Bateys" are rural communities of Dominicans, Haitians, and Dominicans of Haitian descent that grew out of the sugar cane industry. In "bateys," people of Haitian descent are often denied basic human



and civil rights, including citizenship, the right to travel, due process, and have limited access to electricity, healthcare, clean water, sanitation, and education. Listening to the people who live there, especially the kids, I began to uncover a larger picture of what living in a "batey"

means. I feel that my experience there has changed the way I can help people now. I understand more of the world. I know what happens around the world. I encourage everyone to make service projects "your own" – because the act of helping others will help you to grow and change.
