Alumni Christopher Purcell ('06) and Michael Purcell ('08) volunteered for a weeklong mission trip to Trujillo, Honduras this past summer. Alongside their father, Dr. Chris Purcell and a group of thirty others from Espiritu Santo Catholic Church and Fr. Gilberto of St. Cecelia Parish, the group traveled to the Farm of the Child, a Honduran orphanage. They helped the children and volunteers re-roof the maintenance building, paint the convent of the Franciscan Sisters, who help to run the orphanage, and build a new prayer garden; "*The simplicity of Honduran life is unbelievable. The people are not constantly on the phone, making plans, or worrying about the future. Instead, they are happy just "being" and enjoying those around them which keeps them going. The*



entire week we spent in Honduras, through all of the poverty and need, there was hardly anyone who lacked hope, happiness, and love. This trip gave the group a renewed appreciation for the comforts that we have in our lives. A comfortable home, a warm bed, and a relatively easy and indulgent life.
